The Buckhorn Museum also boasts The Hall of Texas Wax Museum first displayed at the World's Fair in San Antonio in 1968. The newest attraction is the Texas Ranger Museum. This museum is divided into three distinct venues. Ranger Gallery, Tales of the Texas Rangers and finally Ranger Town.

The Buckhorn Saloon is where it all started. Where Teddy Roosevelt recruited Rough Riders and Pancho Villa is rumored to have planned the Mexican Revolution. Many of the original furnishings still grace today's Buckhorn Saloon, including the back bar which was hand-crafted of marble and cherry wood. The Buckhorn Saloon has always been known as a gathering place for good conversation and cold beer (well, except during Prohibition, that is). Today, the saloon includes a café. They'll rustle up a mouthwatering steak and a chuck wagon full of quality meals that hark back to the good ol' days.

The Buckhorn Curio Store, "The Oddest Store in the World", has a history almost as old as the Buckhorn itself. Albert Friedrich started the curio store in 1920 to support his family during Prohibition since the Buckhorn had already become somewhat of an attraction the curio store would suite the bill. The Curio Store has always been as full of unique, odd, and downright weird items at the Buckhorn Museum itself!
