a railroad investor.






ND is the United States' leading producer of sunflowers and honey. It also produces enough wheat each year to make 12.6 billion loaves of bread. ND farmland would cover over 21 million city blocks.

On 17 Feb 2007, ND broke the Guinness World Record for the most snow angels in one place. 8,962 people participated in the event held on the state capitol grounds.


