Due to the inclement weather during the winter months, there is a chance the base may be closed when you are scheduled to final out.

PCSing members who are required to hand carry items prior to departing i.e. dental records, NATO, etc will not be able to final-out and the appointment will be rescheduled. However, if you have everything you need to hand-carry, then your final out will be conducted via email, and the Outbound Assignments team will email the forms you need to sign along with instructions.

Separating or retiring members will proceed with the final out appointment virtually, via email. The separations and retirements team will reach out to you to direct you to send your documents and to offer assistance through either email or phone.

Ensure you provide the MPF with a personal email address and phone number to reach you. You are NOT allowed to depart until the MPF send you an email stating the final out is complete and you are allowed to leave Minot. Thank you!
