As of September 27th, 2023, the order that restricted certain programs due to the budget shortage has been rescinded. PSDM 23-67 is available for member to read on myFSS, but a quick summary regarding the changes is below:

PCS: AFPC has the goal of publishing orders up to 180 days prior to departure. All DEROS or AAC 50 extensions will remain firm. Exceptions to Policy for early order authentication, PDD changes, and RNLTD changes will no longer be considered due to normal operations resuming.

Retirements and Separations: All retirements and separations actions have returned to normal operations.

If you are going on a TDY, deploying, taking leave, coming back from leave, or doing anything else that changes your duty status, you must out-process and in-process with your CSS. Whenever you are not present for duty, your CSS updates your duty status to reflect as such, and they update it again once you return. If your duty status is not reflecting correctly, it can negatively affect your pay, ribbons/decorations, and assignment opportunities.

Please make sure you are following the instructions your CSS gives you when it comes to correcting your duty status. Whether that is giving them your DTS voucher when you come back from a TDY or stopping by their office to confirm you have returned from leave, it is important to keep your CSS in the know regarding your whereabouts. There have been some changes when it comes to POCs for personnel systems access. Below is a listing for which office will handle each system and any forms that are required to request access.

- CMS: HR Systems Access Sheet.
- MilPDS: DD2875 and MilPDS User Agreement.
- MyDecs & MyEval: HR Systems Access Sheet (PSM OFFICE handles access ONLY, all other functions for myDecs are handled by DEERS and Force Management handles myEval)
- PRDA RBA Unit Admin: Appointment MFR, must re-accomplished every 180 days.
