# Action Rhymes for Babies and Toddlers

## Lap-Bouncing Action Rhymes

This is the way the lady rides:

Nimble-nim, nimble-nim.

This is the way the gentleman rides:

Gallop-a-trot, gallop-a-trot.

This is the way the farmer rides:

Hobbledehoy, hobbledehoy.

This is the way the butcher-boy rides:

Tripperty-trot, tripperty-trot,

Until he falls into a ditch with a

Fipperty flop, flop, flop!

*(Hold the baby's hands and bounce the baby on your knee, on your foot (for older toddlers), or in your lap slowly for the lady, a little faster, for the gentleman, side to side for the farmer, and quickly for the butcher-boy. At the end, pretend to be about to drop the baby over the side off the back of your knee or separate your legs so that the baby falls between you knees, but be careful to not actually drop the baby.)*

Trot, Trot, to Boston

Trot, trot to Boston,

Trot, trot to Lynn,

Look out, baby,

You're going to fall in!

Trot, trot to Boston,

Trot, trot to Dover,

Look out, baby,

You're going to fall over!

Trot, trot to Boston

Trot, trot to Lyme

Look out, baby,

We'll bounce another time!

*(Holding the baby's hands, bounce the baby on your knee or in your lap. Pretend that you are going to drop the baby during the "You're going to fall in!" and "You're going to fall over!" parts.)*

## Action Rhymes for Before or After Diaper Changing or While the Baby is Lying Down

### Patty-Cake, Patty-Cake

Patty-Cake, Patty-Cake baker's man,

Bake me a cake as fast as you can.

Roll-em and-a roll-em and-a put them in the pan.

*(Clap the baby's feet together for the first two lines, roll or peddle the baby's legs during the third line and touch the baby's toes to his/ her stomach or chest during "put them in the pan.")*

### Toes

This little cow eats grass, *(wiggle pinky toe)*

This little cow eats hay, *(wiggle ring toe)*

This little cow looks over the hedge, *(wiggle middle toe)*

This little cow runs away, *(wiggle pointer toe)*

And this BIG cow does nothing at all but lie in the fields all day!

*(wiggle big toe)*

### Dance, Little Baby

Dance, little baby, dance up high. *(lift the baby up high)*

Never mind, baby, Mama is by. *(lower the baby)*

Crow and caper, caper and crow, *(lift the baby up high)*

There, little baby, down you go. *(lower the baby)*

Up to the ceiling, down to the ground, *(lift the baby up high then lower the baby)*

Backwards and forwards, around and around. *(move the baby as described)*

Dance, little baby, and mother shall sing, *(dance with the baby)*

With the merry gay chorale,

Ding-a-ding, ding.
