Top 5 FAQs – Scholarships/Grants

1. What scholarships are available for military spouses/dependents?

- Air & Space Forces Association offers many scholarships. Go to <u>www.afa.org/scholarships</u> for more information. Application deadlines are April 30, 2024.
- Air Force Aid Society offers grants and scholarships. Go to https://afas.org/haparnoldgrant/ for more information. Application deadline is April 30, 2024.
- Check with your local Base Spouses Club or privatized housing for scholarships.
- There are many other scholarships for military spouses/dependents. Check with your school if they offer one for military spouses or other local organizations.

2. How do I find potential scholarships?

- Use a scholarship search engine to find scholarships that you are eligible for. Here are some search engines to consider:

- Contact your local organizations (bank, chamber of commerce, religious institutions, volunteer organizations, rotary clubs, etc.) for other scholarship opportunities.
- Check with your program at your school some programs have additional scholarships beyond what the university may offer.

3. Do I need to complete/submit FAFSA?

- The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will offer students the opportunity for grants and scholarships at their current or prospective academic institutions.
- Students can complete/fill out a FAFSA every year. Students will need access to income tax records from the previous two years for the FAFSA.

4. What is MyCAA/Am I eligible for MyCAA?

- MyCAA stands for the My Career Advancement Account Scholarship. It's a workforce development program that provides up to **\$4,000** in financial assistance to eligible military spouses for the pursuit or maintenance (including continuing education courses) of a license, certification, or associate's degree necessary to gain employment in an occupation or career field.
- Eligibility requirements:

- i. Spouses of service members on active duty in pay grades E1-E6, W1-W2, and O1-O3.
 - 1. Must have successfully completed high school and able to request tuition assistance while their military sponsor is on Title 10 military orders.
- ii. Spouses of National Guard and Reserves in same pay grades as above.

5. Are there any scholarships at Minot AFB?

- The Balfour Beatty Communities Foundation scholarship is for residents of a Balfour Beatty Communities property (i.e. Minot AFB Family Homes) and provides one-year scholarships for those looking to make a difference both in and out of the classroom. Application deadline is **March 21, 2024.**

- Also, check with the Minot AFB Spouses Club. They usually offer academic scholarships for military spouses/dependents in the spring.

Testing Corner

It is promotion testing season! Here are some tips to remember to ensure that your testing session goes as smooth as possible:

- Pay close attention to the **confirmation emails** you receive regarding your test. These communications have pertinent information regarding date, time, location, and required documents for your specific test.
- Make sure you have your CAC with you. Do not forget this item!
- Plan to arrive NLT 15 minutes **before** your scheduled test time.
- Arrive in **uniform** for all tests. Civilian clothes are <u>not</u> authorized during testing.
- No food or water is allowed in the testing rooms. This includes gum and candy.
- All cell phones, smart watches, fitness trackers, study materials, etc. MUST be left outside the testing room. There are lockers available outside the testing room for your use during your test.
- Don't forget to study and prepare for your test!
