



## Top 4 FAQs – AU-ABC

#### 1. What is the AU-ABC program?

Air University-Associates to Baccalaureate Cooperative (AU-ABC) establishes partnerships between the Air Force and civilian institutions to provide Community College of the Air Force (CCAF) graduates advanced education opportunities at the baccalaureate level. This program targets active-duty Air Force, Air Force Reserve and Air National Guard members. Degree requirements, however, may be completed after students retire or separate from the Air Force. Students will work directly with the AU-ABC school to complete enrollment and degree requirements.

#### 2. What programs are included?

AU-ABC baccalaureate programs cover graduates of all CCAF AAS degrees. Currently more than 200 baccalaureate degree programs are available in a variety of disciplines to include but not all encompassing:

#### 3. Which Civilian Universities are part of AU-ABC?

Each civilian university partner has gone through a review process that links their AU-ABC programs to one or more CCAF degrees.

- Students work directly with the school to enroll and manage degree program progress.
- Upon completion of all requirements, the partnering institution will award the baccalaureate degree.
- Currently more than 55 approved colleges and universities are participating.

#### 4. How do I apply for an AU-ABC program?

• Determine Your Category i. Cat I





- 1. Programs designed for DAF members with a Community College of the Air Force Associate in Applied Science (CCAF AAS) degree. These CCAF graduates are guaranteed that no more than 60 semester hours of additional credit will be required to complete a bachelor's degree.
- ii. Cat II
  - 1. Programs designed primarily for DAF members who are currently enrolled in a CCAF AAS degree program. Partnering institutions will identify specific prerequisite coursework the CCAF students need to complete as part of their CCAF General Education and Program Elective requirements. These courses would simultaneously fill both the CCAF AAS requirements and some of the AU-ABC degree requirements. Upon completion of their CCAF degree, students would be guaranteed that no more than 60 semester hours of additional credit will be required to complete an AU-ABC degree if they follow the published AU-ABC degree plan.
- iii. Cat III
  - 1. Programs which require CCAF AAS graduates to complete more than 60 semester hours of credit beyond the AAS but meet all other AU-ABC specifications.
  - 2. Note: The degrees in this category must still link to one or more CCAF AAS programs and have exceptional value for the Air Force

- Apply to School/Program
  - i. Use the program listing from step 2 to find a program and school which best fits your needs.
- Create Education Goal
  - i. Once you have found an approved AU-ABC program for your AFSC, submit an Education Goal. On Step 2 of the goal submission, <u>ensure you check that this is an AU-ABC goal</u>.
- Start a Funding Request
  - i. Once your Education Goal has been approved, you may apply for tuition assistance from your approved goal in AFVEC

### **Testing Corner**

It is promotion testing season! Here are some tips to remember to ensure that your testing session goes as smooth as possible:

- Pay close attention to the **confirmation emails** you receive regarding your test. These communications have pertinent information regarding date, time, location, and required documents for your specific test.
- Make sure you have your CAC with you. Do not forget this item!
- Plan to arrive NLT 15 minutes **before** your scheduled test time.
- Arrive in **uniform** for all tests. Civilian clothes are <u>not</u> authorized during testing.
- No food or water is allowed in the testing rooms. This includes gum and candy.
- All cell phones, smart watches, fitness trackers, study materials, etc. MUST be left outside the testing room. There are lockers available outside the testing room for your use during your test.
- Don't forget to study and prepare for your test!

## **AF COOL Update**

AFCOOL released new complete guidance, effective 1 Mar 2024. Please see the updated DoDI1322.33\_DAFI 36-2683 and the new AFCOOL Handbook for policy changes.

**HOT:** Effective 6 March 2024, the Private Pilot Certification will ONLY be funded as an AFSC-related certification! AFCOOL will no longer provide funding for the PPL to any service member that cannot create the education goal as PAFSC-related.

**NOTE**: AF COOL funding requests may take up to 14 calendar days for approval from the AF COOL Program Office due to the extensive review process. Members should plan accordingly.
